Ring-a-ding

A symbol of enduring love, you will wear your wedding ring for life, so it should be of sufficient quality to stand up to a long period of wear and tear. Precious metals are first choice, of course, because they do not tarnish. As the years pass you will probably increase the number of rings worn on the wedding finger, adding an eternity ring to the cherished wedding band and engagement ring. It stands to reason, then, that a very wide wedding band will leave less room for additions, another factor to consider when making your choice.
